Activities Covered:

Welcome back after the half term break. Last week, we started a new series of topics under the theme *Growing*. We began with '**Growing - People**' where we learnt the different stages of growth.

In Communication and Language, we talked about each phase of growing up. We discussed how and why each phase is different to one another and learnt all about the phase we are currently in.

In Literacy, we learned the jolly phonics sound "n". We listened to its jolly jingle, learned the action, and practiced writing it with our teacher's help. To help us remember the sound, we made a night scene and a nest craft.

In Mathematics, we were assessed on the topics covered so far for our term 1 report.

In Understanding the World, we listened to the story '*Goldilocks and the Three Bears*'. We then compared the bears sizes and role played the story.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we learnt a new poem called 'My handprints'. We made a lovely keepsake for our home to remind our parents that we are growing up.

Now that we are growing more, we have discovered that we have new abilities and have developed new skills that we didn't have when we were a toddler and a baby.

On Thursday, we tested our abilities in new ways through unusual challenges. We tried to eat a slice of apple without using our hands, rolled a car tire, and even tried to pop a balloon while blindfolded. For displaying resilience and great team spirit, we were rewarded with a 'Yes, I can' badge.
