We listened to the story 'Tiggy Tiger' and learnt about jungle animals' habitat. We had fun creating Tiggy Tiger in his habitat!

Activities Covered:

Welcome back to term 2! We are excited to continue our learning This week, we will travel from the zoo and the jungle to the farm journey. This term will be highlighted by a series of topics on animals. We kick started week 1 with learning all about Zoo and Jungle animals.

In Communication and Language, we listened to and acted out the "The Animal Boogie" story. It was fun! We also played the animal mystery game where our teachers read clues to describe the animals and we had to guess the animal.

For Literacy, we revised the sounds g, o, u, I, f, b and learnt to write words with these sounds. We also learnt two new High Frequency words dad & for and use them in silly sentences.

In Mathematics, we built all the polygon 2D Shapes while listening to the 'Greedy Triangle' story. This was so exciting!

In Physical Development, we learnt some animal movements. These strengthened our core muscles and enhanced our gross motor skills. We all had lots of fun pretending to be the different animals.

In Understanding the World, we learnt about the zoo. We read the story "Dear Zoo". This was followed up with a zoo mural and creating some of zoo animals from the story.

In Expressive Arts and Design, we listened to the interesting story 'How Andrew the Giraffe Got His Spots'. Then we performed a giraffe print experiment using kitchen towels and paint.

On Thursday, we acted out the 'Dear Zoo' story. We were thrilled to dress up as one of the animals in the story. That was not all! After our performance, we had to match each animal to the food that they eat.

It was a fantastic first week back at school.

Upcoming Activities:

and learn all about Farm animals. We will be looking at the different animals that live on a farm and their habitat.

In Communication and Language, we will read the story "Wake up on Bumble Farm". We will sequence the story in our own words and choose a farm animal to make as a craft.

Personal, Social, and Emotional Development, we will discuss how the role of a farmer is important and explore his duties.

In Physical Development, we will be moving our bodies in different ways when we copy farm animal movements in a yoga activity.

In **Literacy**, we will learn the sounds **ai** & **j**. We will learn their actions, songs, and formation before practicing them in our books. The High-Frequency words for this week are and & am.

In Mathematics, we will continue with revising the polygon shapes using the classroom resources. We will count how many sides they have and match them to their correct picture.

In Understanding the World, we will act out the 'Old McDonald Had a Farm' song and play a guessing game about farm animal sounds.

We look forward to another lovely week ahead.
