We learnt the number 11 through counting and recognising activities.



We learned all about farm animals and their sounds. We could choose to make a horse, chicken, duck, or a sheep craft.

## Activities Covered:

We have jumped right into fun and activities this term. Last week, we learned all about the farm and the animals.

In **Communication and Language**, we learnt what a farm is, discovered what kind of animals live on a farm, and made a farm animal craft. Then we added our animals to a farm mural that we worked together to paint.

In **Physical Development**, we stretched our bodies while doing farm animal yoga. We started it a bit wobbly, but we didn't give up. With repetition, we managed to copy the movements smoothly.

In **Literacy**, we revised the jolly phonics sounds **t** and **i**. We practiced writing these sounds in different mediums and our phonics books. We are getting much better at forming the sounds correctly. Furthermore, we continued to visually discriminate these sounds amongst others.

In **Mathematics**, we learnt the number 11 through various counting and writing practices using different materials and techniques.

In **Understanding the World**, we learnt the names of farm animals' babies. Then we completed different matching games, including identifying the animals' sounds.

On **Thursday**, we had the most exciting experience ever! We went on our first school trip to the North Sedra Farm to learn about the animals and produce of the farm animals. We got to ride the pony and water boats, as well as feeding the animals. It was a great day out!

What a fun-filled week learning about animals, and we are thrilled for next week's activities!

## Upcoming Activities:

This week, we will continue with our topic of Farm Animals, and we will focus on the farm animals' produce. We will also learn about other products from the farm.

In **Communication and Language**, we will discuss the role of farm animals on the farm. We will also listen to the story '**How Bees Make Honey**'. Later, we will follow Curious George on this adventure. Then, we will make beehive artwork.

In **Physical Development**, we will practice our cutting skills as we match different farm products to their correct animal.

In **Literacy**, we will revise the jolly phonics sounds **p** and **n**. We will recall words beginning with these sounds and practice writing them using the correct formations.

In **Mathematics**, we will learn the number 12 through various hands-on activities. We will also learn how to make AABB and ABC patterns using various resources around the classroom.

Another exciting week awaits us!
