Activities Covered:

Last week, we went down into the deep blue the sea to learn all about **Sea Animals**. We made lots of discoveries!

For **Communication and Language**, we read the story '*A House for a Hermit Crab*' by Eric Carl to learn lots of interesting facts about hermit crabs and the new sea creature friends he met while looking for his new shell.

For **Physical Development**, we got energised by doing under the sea Yoga. We copied different movements for each sea creature. We walked side to side like crabs, rocked forward and backward over our arms like dolphins and even bent like a jellyfish.

For **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we reinforced the value of friendship and sharing through the story '*The Rainbow Fish*'.

For **Literacy**, we learnt the sounds **ee** and **or**. And practiced blending them with other sounds to read new words. The High-Frequency Words were **his** & **him**.

For **Mathematics**, we continued with learning 3D shapes and learnt the rectangular prism (cuboid), pyramid and cylinder. We recognised them in our classroom environment and built them with clay and straws.

For **Understanding the World**, we learnt that some sea creatures live in aquariums around the world. Then we made an aquarium using a small plastic bottle and other natural materials.

On Thursday, we were very excited to go and visit a real Aquarium at Hamad Port. We joyed seeing the live animals we learnt about and strolled down the hall that gave us the illusion of walking under water.

It was a wonderful week of learning!

Upcoming Activities:

This week we are back on land and will travel back in time reliving the Jurassic era. We cannot wait to learn and explore all the different types of **Dinosaurs**.

In **Communication and Language**, we will listen and discuss the stories '*Harry and the Dinosaurs Have a Busy Day*', '*Stomp, Chomp, Big Roars! Here Come the Dinosaurs!*' and '*Dinosaurs Galore*'. After our discussions and retelling the stories in our own words, we will choose our preferred dinosaur mask to make.

In **Literacy**, we will be introducing two new jolly phonic sounds **z** & **w**, and the High-Frequency Words for this week will be **not** & **got**.

In **Mathematics**, we will introduce the topic of measurement, where will measure and compare different lengths and sizes of objects.

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we are going to have fun being palaeontologists for the week as we learn about fossils and bones.

For **Personal, Social, and Emotional Development**, we will learn how dinosaurs were born years ago which will be followed by an exciting science fizzy dinosaur egg experiment!

We can't wait to go back in time and relive the Jurassic era.
