In phonics, we practiced the formation of the sound 'd' in our workbook.

Activities Covered:

Last week, we all became entomologists and studied different minibeasts around us. We discussed their distinguished features and how they crawl or fly.

In **Communication and Language**, we read the story "*The Very Busy Bee*" and had a class discussion regarding our source of honey. We also made a cute honeybee craft after that.

In **Personal, Social, and Emotional Development**, we read the story '*The Very Hungry Caterpillar*'. We got to know about the transition from a caterpillar into a beautiful butterfly.

In **Physical Development**, we learnt about spiders and how they make their web. Then we threaded a spider web just like a spider does. This was a good activity to strengthen our fine motor skills.

In **Literacy**, we learned the jolly phonics sound "d". We practiced pronouncing and writing it using our magic fingers and in our phonics books. To help us remember the sound, we got to make a duck craft.

In **Mathematics**, we revised all the numbers, shapes, colours, and patterns we have learned so far for our Term 2 assessment.

In **Understanding the World**, we made a big class mural which showed a minibeast garden and all the different insects we made throughout the week using different techniques.

On **Thursday**, we had an amazing day! Some of us came to school with bugs we caught and showed them to all our friends. We also participated in different minibeast games and loved exploring different types of creepy crawlers. It was fun!

It was another week full of excitement and learning!

Upcoming Activities:

This week will be all about **Day and Night**. We will be highlighting the beauty of our planet from the stunning colours of a sunset to the mystery of the night sky. We will also discover day and night animals.

In **Communication and Language**, we will have an open discussion about activities we do during the day and night. We will then compare these activities to see the similarities and differences between them. There will also be a quiz to test our understanding of the day and night.

For **Mathematics**, we will practice counting backwards from 10 to 0 and we will focus on missing numbers from 1 to 10.

In **Literacy**, we will learn the jolly phonics sound /g/. We will continue to distinguish it from other sounds and learn its action, song, and formation.

In **Understanding the World**, we will learn about the animals that come out during the night and make an owl craft.

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we will learn about day animals and make a beautiful butterfly craft.
