Activities Covered:

Last week, we explored the **Spring** season. We read stories, made exciting crafts, and conducted experiments to help us remember all the wonderful things about spring.

In Communication and Language, we learnt how the weather and nature changes and how it impacts what type of clothes we should wear. Spring is also the time when animals have their babies. So, we learnt baby animal names and match them to their mothers.

In Personal, Social, and Emotional development we read the story "The Cautious Caterpillar". We discussed the emotions of worry and bravery from the perspective of Cody the caterpillar and how we can manage these emotions in our daily lives.

In Physical Development, we focused don using our fine motor skills to paint, cut and decorate materials for the flower competition.

In Literacy, we learnt the jolly phonics sounds th and th. We during the season of summer. We will listen to the story "The learnt the difference between these sounds and made crafts to help us remember them. We also introduce two new HFWs 'go' and 'into' which we continued to build new sentences with.

In **Mathematics**, we discovered the topic greater than, less than and equal to. We used the hands-on approach to compare items in groups.

In Understanding the World, we listened to the story 'A Thing About Spring' which was followed by a colourful rain experiment in a jar using shaving foam, water, and food colouring. It was interesting!

On Thursday, we participated in a flower competition between classes. We also made cards for Mother's Day and took them home as a gift to our mummies. We also make a fun rainbow experiment using dish washing soap.

Upcoming Activities:

This week, we will complete the seasons topic by learning about Summer. We will read stories and perform different experiments that will teach us more about summer. We will also be learning the differences and similarities between all the seasons.

In Communication and Language, we will listen to and discuss the story "Milo Goes to the Beach". Then we will explore summer treats and make ice cream. There's an interesting science behind making it.

In Literacy, we will have assessments on the sounds and highfrequency words covered so far this term.

In Mathematics, we will be introducing the concept of doubling and halving numbers using various hands-on resources in class.

In Understanding the World, we will focus on how trees change Seasons of Arnold's Apple Tree". The activity will be followed by a tree craft to demonstrate our knowledge.

It is going to be another week of fun learning and exciting discoveries.
