Activities Covered:

Last week we concluded our topic series on **Seasons** and focused on **Summer**. We discussed how we need to protect our skin from the hot sun by using sunblock, wearing hats, and sunglasses.

In **Communication and Language**, we listened to the story "**Pete at the Beach**" and discussed what the weather looks like in summer, what we wear, where we go, and how outdoor places feel. Furthermore, we discussed our favourite summer activities.

In **Personal**, **Social**, and **Emotional Development**, we learnt about the different places we can go in summer with a focus on beach activities such as building sandcastles and playing with shells. We shared our own experiences of going to the beach and which activities we liked to do the most.

In **Physical Development**, we played some traditional summer games like hopscotch and water races.

In **Literacy**, we revised all the jolly phonics sounds learnt and had our final assessment for the term. We also practiced listening to the learnt sound in words.

For **Mathematics**, we continued to learn about **prepositions**. We learned to differentiate between **in** and **on**. We also learned the concept of **under**, **behind**, and **in front**.

In Understanding the World, we discussed how we can keep ourselves cooler in summer and made a hand fan.

On Thursday, we came to school for summer fun! We participated in various games and activities such as beach volleyball, water races, and even splashed in a small pool. We enjoyed getting wet and the weather played its part. We ended the activities with an ice-cold lolly.

What an exciting week it was, learning about summer!



In our phonics lessons, we revised all learned sounds, and we practice writing sounds on our yellow books.

Upcoming Activities:

This week is all about experimenting and creating science. We will attempt different **STEAM** activities to discover new things where we will be mixing, pouring, and stirring.

In **Communication and Language**, we will do a magic milk experiment with milk, food colouring, and dish soap to see how they react when these ingredients are mixed.

In **Mathematics**, we will be revising numbers, shapes, and patterns learnt to date using various hands-on resources.

In **Literacy**, we will continue with the revision of sounds. We will play listening games, match the sounds to the correct picture, as well as practice the formation of all the sounds.

In **Understanding the World**, we will get creative with our experiments and will perform the famous Coke and Mentos experiment which will display how gas reacts with menthol. We will also learn to blow a balloon using vinegar and baking soda instead of using our mouths.

Looks like a creative and fun week ahead!

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The most exciting moment was the swimming poll activity. We played with the balls and splashed water to one another.
