## Activities Covered:

This week it was exciting to explore different **STEAM** activities. We pretended to be scientists and explored the different ingredients and materials. We displayed our knowledge of science, technology, engineering, arts, and maths through various exciting challenges. The best part was using everyday resources in these activities.

In **Communication and Language**, we listened to the story '*Pete the Cat and the Supercool Science Fair*'. The story was followed with 'wiggly worms' experiment. We used a combination of kitchen roll, a pencil, markers, and water for this challenge. It was amazingly interesting!

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we made invisible ink and used that to draw a picture. Then we relieved our picture using a turmeric solution that we also made. That was mind-boggling!

In **Literacy**, we revised all the sounds that we have learnt and specifically focus on the *ai, j, oa, ie, ee, or* sounds. We used the sounds that we have learnt to write our own words. We also revised all High-Frequency words learnt so far and continue to build sentences with them.

In **Mathematics**, we revised the concepts of **addition** and **subtraction**. We participated in different hands-on activities to practice the concepts.

In **Understanding the World**, we used primary colours to conduct a walking rainbow experiment we watched as the primary colours combined to make secondary colours like orange, green, and purple.

Today, we came to school dressed as cool scientists to perform more exciting experiments. We rotated all the classes during the day to participate in some fun challenges such as making cloudy dough, magic rain, lemon volcanoes, and hot ice.

We had a great week and now, we are ready for the Spring break!

## Upcoming Activities:

When we resume school after the break, we will begin term 3 with **Book Week**. Our chosen author for this year is Eric Carle who is famous for his books like *The Very Hungry Caterpillar*, *The Mixed-up Chameleon*, etc.

Our class-chosen book is *Brown Bear, Brown Bear, What Do You See?*

In **Communication and Language**, we will read and discuss the story. Then, we will re-tell the story in sequence, followed by making our own book.

In **Literacy**, *qu* & *ou* will be our sounds of the week. We will continue to work on writing words, and sentences and controlling letter size. The HFWs for the week will be **he** and **she**.

In **Mathematics**, we will start learning the subitising concept, where we recognise the number patterns visually without counting each item.

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we will focus on practicing for the school concert and graduation ceremony that is fast approaching.
