Activities Covered:

Welcome back to term 3! We've had a great start with **Book Week**. Our focused author for this term was Eric who is very famous for his children's books like 'Brown Bear Brown Bear', 'What do You See', 'The Very Hungry Caterpillar', 'The Bad-Tempered Ladybird', and 'The Very Busy Spider'.

Our class-chosen book was *The Bad-Tempered Ladybird*.

In **Communication and Language**, we listened to the story and discussed grumpy emotions and how they can lead us to make bad decisions toward others.

In **Physical Development**, we worked on pencil control and traced along the ladybird steps.

In **Personal, Social, and Emotional Development** we enjoyed practicing for the school concert. We worked on our class song "Walking in the Jungle", singing, and moving along with the song.

In **Literacy**, we learnt the jolly phonics sound 'l' as in lollipop. We learned its action, and song, and then practiced its formation in different mediums and our workbooks.

In **Mathematics**, we learned how to sequence events & describe familiar routes. We tried to recall our morning routine from the time we woke up and arrived at school. Furthermore, we learned the hexagon shape.

On **Tuesday** we celebrated World Book Day by coming to school dressed as our favourite book character. We also brought along our favourite books for the teacher to read to us. We also paraded our costumes for all to see.

On **Thursday** we rotated all the classes to learn about the books they had been exploring last week and complete various activities based on these books. It was an amazing week!

Upcoming Activities:

This week we will be starting a two-week series topic on Community Helpers and will focus on emergency field helpers such as the police, doctors, dentists, firemen, and paramedics. We will also learn the emergency number of Qatar, which is 999.

In **Communication and Language**, we will learn about listening to emergency sounds such as ambulance sirens, fire drills, and police sirens. We will also be learning about the differences between Qatar's civil defence and those outside Qatar.

In **Mathematics**, we will continue working on sequencing events & describing familiar routes through various hands-on tasks. Furthermore, we will finally learn about the crescent moon shape.

In **Literacy**, we will learn the jolly phonics sound 'f'. We learn its action, and song, formation in different mediums. We will make a flower craft to help us remember the sound.

In **Physical Development**, we are going to roleplay being police officers.
