Activities Covered:

Last week, we continued with the theme Community Helpers, focussing on non-emergency helpers.

In **Communication and Language**, we learnt new vocabulary names of all the kinds of Community Helpers that we may encounter in our daily lives. We focussed on the role of a chef and did some baking, making delicious cookies.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we learnt the role of a pilot and a flight attendant and listened to the story '*Maisy Goes on a Plane*'.

In **Physical Development**, we learnt about the role of the hairdresser and practiced our cutting skills cutting along curvy and straight lines to make strips of hair.

In **Literacy**, we learnt a new jolly phonics sound /l/ and made an awesome lion craft to remember the sound.

In **Maths**, we focussed on the crescent shape, and we also learnt all about sequencing events and did an activity to sequence our routine of what we do before we go to bed.

In **Understanding the World**, we learnt about garbage cleaners and the important role they play in cleaning up our neighbourhood. We had fun listening to a cool song all about 'The Garbage Truck'.

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we continued the role of the chef and made a baker's hat and decorated a picture of a cupcake with puffy paint. It was so much fun and looked so yummy that we wished we could eat it!

On Thursday, we went on our school trip to KidZania, and wow, what a day it was! We had such an eventful morning exploring all the different community helpers we find in Qatar. It really was a great day!

Upcoming Activities:

It's a new week, and this week is all about books. Our chosen author this year is Heather Amery, who is famous for writing the Usborne book series.

In **Communication and Language**, we will be introduced to our book called '*There's a Dinosaur in My School*'. We will read the story and discuss the behaviours we display in different environments.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we will go through the story again and take turns to dress up with clothing from the dress up box and act out different scenes from the story.
