## Activities Covered:

Last week, we explored the topic 'My Home.' We talked about the special people who live with us, how families care for one another, and why it's important to show love and respect at home.

In **Communication and Language**, we listened to the story 'Welcome to my home.' It was a simple and heart-warming story that taught us about family members, the roles they play, and the love and care that families share.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we talked about helping each other at home and the chores we have.

In **Mathematics**, we explored the numbers 4 and 5, focusing on the concepts of adding 1 more and subtracting 1 less. We examined various ways to represent the numbers 4 and 5.

Last week in **Literacy**, the children participated in a Literacy Assessment. They were evaluated on their ability to recognize letter sounds, blend simple words, and understand basic high-frequency words.

In **Physical Development**, we built our own home, divided it into 4 sections of a house >)

In our **Understanding the World** lesson, we explored and discussed different types of homes and how they vary from one another.

In **Expressive Arts**, we made a mini craft depicting home.

On Thursday, we invited the children to explore and arrange furniture within a house floor plan to build their "home". They chose which items belong in each room and decided on the layout together with their friends. Then they played together in the different rooms practicing some of the activities we learnt about together in the week. They did very well to describe the activities they can practice using the correct furniture and appliances.

## Upcoming Activities:

This week, we are exploring the topic 'My Emotions.' We will learn to identify different feelings such as happiness, sadness, anger, and surprise, and discuss what causes these emotions. Through stories and games, they will also discover healthy ways to express and manage their feelings while learning to understand how others feel, too.

In **Literacy**, we will learn the sounds "m" and "d"! To make it even more fun, we created wonderful crafts linked to words that start with this sound. We will learn the high-frequency words *it*, *in* blending sounds letter groups 1,2.

In **Communication and Language**, we will listen to the story 'Sad, Glad Monster.' It is a fun and meaningful story that helps children recognize and name different feelings, such as happiness, sadness, fear, and anger. The story encourages children to understand that all emotions are normal and teaches them healthy ways to express how they feel

In **Mathematics**, this week, the children had their **Mathematics Assessment**. We will be assessed on key concepts such as understanding one more and one less, verbal counting, number recognition up to 10 (and beyond), and identifying basic shapes. These assessments help us understand each child's progress and support their continued learning

We're getting ready for another week filled with adventures, learning, and lots of exciting activities!!
