Look at all our Palaeontologists looking for dinosaur fossils. They just loved this activity!

Activities Covered:

Last week we explored the world of **Dinosaurs** and had so much fun learning all about how they lived and why they became extinct.

In **Communication and Language**, we learnt the names of the different Dinosaurs and revised everything about carnivores, herbivores and omnivores.

In **Literacy**, we continued with our Jolly Phonics and our sound for the week was /o/ and made an octopus craft to remember the letter.

In **Mathematics**, we learnt the concept of heavy and light, and we practiced this by measuring a variety of different items using a scale to see which one was heavy and which one was light.

In **Understanding of the World**, they made a volcano out of clay and then did an experiment to see how a volcano erupts. This was so amazing!

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we did some dinosaur prints by putting on some makeshift dinosaur feet, painting the feet and stomping on a big sheet of paper.

In **Physical Development**, we learnt about what a Palaeontologist does and did some fossil digging using magnifying glasses and brushes. During the week we also prepared and practiced our races for our upcoming Sports Day.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we listened to the story **Harry and the bucket full of dinosaurs** and played a fun dinosaur game! We had a blast!

On **Thursday**, we enjoyed a fun day finding Dinosaur fossils cracking open an egg to see what was inside, we played some cool games and came dressed up like a Dinosaur! It was such an awesome day!

Upcoming Activities:

After the Mid-Term Break, our next theme is **Growing Plants**, this is going to be an interesting week learning all about how plants grow.

In **Communication and Language**, we will listen to the story "The Tiny Seed" which tells us all about the journey from a seed to a grown plant.

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we will do an experiment growing some bean seeds in the class and watch how the seed transforms into a plant.

In **Physical Development**, we will plant our own little grass garden to take home and look after.

In **Understanding of the World**, we will learn about the life cycle of a plant and do an activity to sequence the growth of a plant in the correct order.

In **Expressive Arts and Design**, we will listen to the story "Sam's Sunflowers" and make a lovely, yellow sunflower craft to remember this story.

It's going to be a busy week with lots of hands-on exploration and fascinating activities to help us learn all about plants and how they grow!



In **UW**, we learnt about how dinosaurs became extinct and did a volcano experiment in class. It was super cool!
