## Activities Covered:

Last week, we joyfully celebrated Nursery Rhymes Week, where children explored the wonderful world of classic rhymes through music, storytelling, and creative play.

In **Communication and Language**, we learned new vocabulary and read the very lovely story called "Five little ducks".

In **Personal, Social and Emotional Development**, we threaded our own spider webs, and each student chose how they would colour and decorate their spiders while we sang along to the very famous "Itsy-Bitsy Spider" rhyme.

In **Mathematics**, we started a very exciting and important topic, the 3D shapes, we have learned about the characteristic of cubes, spheres, cylinders, and cones through hands-on activities and real-life examples. Making sure we know how to recognize them in our surroundings and find great examples of their use.

In **Literacy**, we had our very last phonic sounds lessons for this year, we have learned the sounds "er" and "ar", Did some amazing crafts and learned our sound songs and practiced our writing and reading skills. We will learn the two new high frequency words: **like** and **yes**.

In **Physical Development**, we continued with our weekly rehearsals of our End of year concert "The little stars that learned to shine".

In **Understanding the World**, students enjoyed a fun and creative "Baa Baa Black Sheep" craft activity. They designed and assembled their own sheep using a variety of materials such as cotton, paper, and glue, bringing the nursery rhyme to life through art.

In **Expressive Arts and design**, we did our very best in practicing our song, "Look how far we've come" that we will be performing at the end of the year concert.

On Thursday we moved from classroom to classroom to play nursery rhyme games and act out different parts from the rhymes. We learnt how to make Patta cakes and play Humpty Dumpty splat to name a few!

## Upcoming Activities:

This week we celebrate an exciting and inspiring Book Week filled with imagination, storytelling, and a love for reading. Throughout the week, students will have a chance to explore a variety of stories, participate in read-aloud sessions, and engage in fun activities such as character dress-up, storytelling circles, and creative art inspired by their favourite books. In **Mathematics**, we have another important week as our previously acquired knowledge in the important areas of doubling, provision, and 3D shapes will be assessed.

We look forward to seeing our young readers bring their favourite characters to life and celebrate the joy of books together!
